What is Youth Worker 4.0?

The expert group on risks, opportunities and implications of digitalisation for youth, youth work and youth policy, set up by the European Union Work Plan for Youth for 2016-2018, acknowled that new technologies emerge rapidly. Knowing how technology is built, learning to be critical towards information, and being curious as well as critical towards new technologies is more important every day. Digital literacy skills play a crucial role as part of modern-day citizenship. All young people of today will need technological skills and youth work should be able to encourage this.

Digital work with young people means proactively using digital media and technology as a tool in working with young people.

In this perspective, this project aims to provide digital learning tools to be used in daily work with young people, can contribute to improve our institutional role as professionals.

This project is in line with the objectives of the Erasmus+ program, and in particular in this key action, by training youth workers, members of youth organizations, and other youth actors with the skills and methodologies values for young people, while also preventing their radicalization and exclusion; to equip professionals with the knowledge, skills and attitudes needed to successfully manage and support diversity; to support technicians in developing and sharing effective methods to reach young people with fewer opportunities.

In this sense, APPJUVENTUDE intends to develop this project, in order to create tools so that youth workers can use the digital tools as a way to reach young people and promote their social integration, personal development and improve their employability.

This project includes 6 partner organizations. In the implementation phase of the activity (TC) will be present 4 youth workers from each organization.

During this TC we will work with various tools and applications to try out creative ways to use them with a focus on digital activities. Participants will be invited to discover the concept of digital work with young people and to discuss the current challenges that youth work faces in a digital age.

Objectives

- Sharing experiences and good practices of youth work using digital media
- Develop creative digital activities and digital project ideas for youth work
- Reflect and analyze the transferability of the different tools to the daily life of organizations
- Prepare participants to introduce digital approaches to their work practice with youth
- Building a broader understanding of what an inclusive attitude through ICT means
- To better understand digital approaches to working with youth
- Reflect on the role of youth worker in a digital world
- Understand how the development of digital can influence the employability of young people
- Increase interest in the implementation of Erasmus +, KAI and KA2 projects as a way of developing life skills, tools for social inclusion and improving young people's skills and attitudes
- To create ideas for future projects under the Erasmus + JA program for the training of youth workers
- To improve the quality of work in youth, in particular by strengthening cooperation between organizations in this sector








ABOUT





DISCOVER



Cava de Viriato is one of the most emblematic engineering works, from the centuries IX-X preserved from the Iberian Peninsula. Many doubts remain about who ordered the rise of such a monument. It's Viseu's biggest mystery yet! Cava de Viriato is a monument with an octagonal plan, with 32ha of area, and it consists of eight slopes on land with 250m of length each.

On top of the hill, beside the Cathedral, stands the museum of Grão Vasco, it contains a substantial expression of our identity in the realism of the work of Vasco Fernandes, in whose paintings light and colour blend in perfect symbiosis and there is harmony in the ambience, emotions and shapes of faces and care taken with detail.







Entering the Renaissance Garden of the Former Bishop's Palace in Fontelo, you step back into the 16th century, to the time when gardens were designed to celebrate Man's rule over Nature.

RECURRING EVENTS



If you go to Viseu from the beginning of August until mid-September, you can visit the São Mateus Fair is located in the huge parking near the Viriato Statue.

With over 624 years, this is one of the oldest fairs in Portugal. Here, you'll find local handicrafts, folk music, a funfair, several food stalls, Portuguese and international artists concerts. Over these more or less 30 days of amusement, more than one million visitors go to this fair.

If you go to Viseu from the beginning of July this event. Every year, the Ephemeral Gardens festival jolts Viseu, a serene city in the interior of Portugal. Artists adorn Viseu with modern art and serenade it with contemporary music.

Shops become installation spaces, ancient churches double as music venues, old walls serve as canvases for street art. Every plaza seems to have its own DJ, every garden its own sculpture show. It also has stores, bookshops, restaurants, and bars that stay open until late.
